New and emerging efforts


- Collaborative effort with NC 211 on tax-filing

- Resources to put in front of taxpreparers



MDC's value statements regarding tax-prep

- Service should always be truly free to low- and moderate-income NC residents
 - No additional cost for e-filing or for ACA forms
- Literacy a tax-filing service should be written around the 8th grade reading level
- Services should not be advertising credit-cards and other financial products unless they promote saving
- A consumer should have a similar experience between self-serve and counselor-assisted (no additional complexity)

I had health insurance coverage, but not through healthcare.gov


What was your health coverage status in 2014?
