A financing arrangement in which...



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
Payments are indexed to the value of expected outcomes rather than the cost of providing services Payments are fully or partially conditional on achievement of pre- agreed outcomes

Outcomes-based Financing

can be used to secure external investment capital to finance upfront costs

Benefits of Value-based Contracting and Outcomes Based Financing for Service Providers and Payors







We Can Help To:

- Define and strengthen value proposition to potential payors such as managed care plans, health systems, or government stakeholders
- Compare program costs to the quantified value of programs along with existing and potential revenue streams
- Identify and engage potential payors
- Create the operating and contracting models that are rooted in partners' shared understanding of the value of outcomes being created
- Structure the financing required to close budget gaps, scale programs, and limit service provider risk through outcomes-based financing


Significant Expansion of DC Medical Respite Capacity

Project Goal

 Create new care model for AmeriHealth Caritas DC members experiencing homelessness and address broader community shortage of appropriate housing

Outcomes

- Hope Has a Home, a new 16-bed, low-barrier medical respite program launched in fall 2019 by Volunteers of America Chesapeake and Carolinas in partnership with Unity Healthcare and Pathways to Housing
- Reduced utilization of acute care services and associated costs
- Increased member connection to stable, non-shelter housing
- Total cost of care savings per member of more than \$14,000

 Create a financially sustainable program and organizational structure in Baltimore for home delivered groceries. Designed to address food insecurity service gap and provide local workforce development.

QV Role:




